The "Bronze Keyboard" PowerBook G3 series was announced in May 1999. It included several improvements to the previous PowerBook G3, including the addition of on-board USB, and the option of an on-board MPEG-2 decoder. The big news, however, was that the "Bronze" was 20% thinner than its predecessor, nearly two pounds lighter, and boasted significantly longer battery life. Some sacrifices were made to achieve the new form factor, most notably the inclusion of only a single PC-card slot (previous powerbooks had two.).

The "Bronze Keyboard" PowerBook G3 came in two configurations: the 333 Mhz was initially sold for \$2,499, and the 400 Mhz DVD model was \$3,499. (there was no DVD upgrade path for the 333Mhz model.) Although Steve Jobs originally announced a May 20 shipping date, few units
